# **Hybrid Learning Model**

| Monday    | Blue Day (A-K in school;<br>L-Z at home) | Normal school schedule   |
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| Tuesday   | Gold Day (L-Z in school;<br>A-K at home) | Normal school schedule   |
| Wednesday | SAL/Asynchronous<br>Learning Day         | Students work on posted assignments; teachers available during online office hours |
| Thursday  | Blue Day (A-K in school;<br>L-Z at home) | Normal school schedule   |
| Friday    | Gold Day (L-Z in school;<br>A-K at home) | Normal school schedule   |

#### Schedule

- Classes will be held four days per week, on an alternating two-day schedule.
- All students will attend school every weekday except Wednesday, either in person or electronically through videoconferencing.
- Half of the student body will attend school on Monday and Thursday ("Blue Day"), and the other half will attend on Tuesday and Friday ("Gold Day"). Students will follow the usual seven-period, seven-day rotating schedule.
- On Wednesdays, students will complete work at home as a Structured Alternative Learning (SAL) Day; teachers will be available during online "office hours."

### Instruction

• In-person and remote students will attend the same class sessions, conducted by the teacher.

#### **Attendance and Grading**

- Teachers will take attendance each class period and record it in the School Information System (SIS).
- Students working remotely must arrive on time and stay in the meeting for the entire duration of the class.
- Remote mode students will be held accountable for assignment completion, participation, and standard grading expectations.
- Grades will be issued as in-person instruction.

## **Student Expectations**

- Students must follow all academic policies as outlined in the Parent-Student Handbook, including the detailed section on remote learning guidelines.
- Students must have their video cameras on and must be live, with faces on camera, during meetings.
- Students must be dressed in SFXP school uniform, or for JPII students, professionally and appropriately, e.g., collared shirts, work-professional blouses, etc., and not wearing hats.
