What is ABAB Day?

What to donate?

- Pencil boxes
- Index cards
- New earbuds
- Glue sticks
- Highlighters
- Pencils
- Binders
- Notebook
- Folders
- New Books (only) for students grade 6 – 12
- Pens (blue or black)
- Square root and scientific calculators
- *Backpacks (Grades 7-12) - required to participate in ABAB day*

What are the rules?



Safety First: No weapons, dangerous items, or anything that could cause harm.



No Living Things: Animals, pets, or even younger siblings are not allowed as carriers.



School Appropriate: Items must follow dress code and handbook rules



Portable and Practical: Must be manageable by one person (no riding on it), fit through doors, and fit next to you in class.



Non-Motorized: No motorized items like bikes or scooters.



Respect Property: Items should not damage school property or create messes.

Examples of Allowed Items

- Bags/Baskets: beach bags, laundry baskets, toy shopping carts, wicker baskets, reusable grocery bags, coolers, purses.
- Containers: Milk crates, toolboxes (empty of tools), buckets, cooking pots, cereal boxes, instrument case
