Dear SMPS/SFXP/JPII Students, Families, Faculty, and Staff Members,

Under normal circumstances, you'd look for your "Sunday morning email" to stay up-to-date on all of the busy-ness of school life. You will continue to receive *The Blue & Gold Weekly* email, but as we all know, I write to you under far-from-normal circumstances.

First and foremost, I assure you that we are complying fully with all health and safety guidelines. To my knowledge, no students, staff, or family members have been diagnosed with or suspected of having COVID-19. Should any new information come forward, we will adhere strictly to the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and Barnstable Health Department guidelines and communicate with you as fully and promptly as possible. Furthermore, school is closed to students, faculty members, and all but core, essential staff members and administrators. The maintenance staff has been disinfecting the buildings methodically, with my gratitude. Faculty members, and/or staff members who need to come to school should first contact their building principal.

Currently, school is closed until Monday, April 6. However, I am not alone in expecting this closure period to extend much longer.

From an academic standpoint, we have completed our first three days of remote learning. You have adjusted quickly to this new mode. Of course, there have been glitches and the full range of early-to-late adopters; but overall, I am impressed and grateful for the rich tapestry of engaged learning that has taken place already. Now entering our first full week, glitches will be minimized, people will get the hang of it, and school will continue steadily. I credit the strong student-teacher relationships for this quick transition. These relationships are the glue that will keep it together until we meet again.

Public schools, for reasons of equity and special education law, cannot "count" student



Finally, as Bishop da Cunha said in his Friday prayer service, recent events have laid bare our dependence on God ("The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away. Blessed be the name of the LORD." [Job 1:21]). Let us continue in Lenten prayer, gratitude for his gifts, and see an increase in our Faith.
